## Children and Teenagers with Asperger's Syndrome

As the mothers of challenging young men with Asperger's Syndrome we realise how difficult it can be at times to access appropriate resources, services and help for our children.

We also found that books on the subject did not reflect our situations, so, we have written our own book - **Children and Teenagers with Aspergers: The Journey of Parenting from Birth to Teens** which reflects our reality of bringing up children on the autistic spectrum, written from the perspective of seven parents.

We are also now conducting research into other people's experiences of bringing up children with Asperger's Syndrome via two surveys which are now available on our website ([www.asteens.co.uk/questionnaires.html](http://www.asteens.co.uk/questionnaires.html)).

We have had quite a good response so far, with lots of valuable information from parents and carers of children with AS across the UK, including the following comments -

We are conducting this research out of our own pocket and in our own time, but need to make these questionnaires - that have been given to us free of charge and built to produce valid results by the Viewpoint Organisation ([www.vptorg.com](http://www.vptorg.com)) - available to a wider audience.

Once we have this information from a broad spectrum of parents/carers of AS children from across the country, we will be able to analyse the results which will form the basis of a report which will be published on our web-site and also presented to the government.

We are carrying out this research on behalf of all parents struggling with LEAs, medical professionals, youth justice services etc to access the appropriate resources for their children with Asperger's Syndrome.
